CLASSROOM PRESENTATIONS

KINDNESS COUNTS(Grades K-2)

How can kind acts make positive change? Kindness Counts builds compassion by teaching students to recognize and respect an animal's emotions. Through understanding emotions we can act with empathy and kindness.

THE FARM ANIMAL CONNECTION (Grades K-2)

What do farm animals need to be happy and healthy? Students will examine the similarities between themselves and farm animals to learn what farm animals need to live happy lives.

THE FARM-FOOD CONNECTION* (Grades 3-10)

How do we know if farm animals are living happy lives? In this presentation, students will explore the lives of farm animals, what the labels on our food mean, and how our actions can make a difference for farm animals.

BITE FREE (All grades)

Why do animals bite? By giving students the tools to read body language, we help them understand how to interact safely and responsibly with pets.

YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE* (Grades 3-7)

How can you improve the lives of animals? After learning about animal issues, students will develop creative solutions to improve animals' lives, and become animal advocates in their community.

MAKING THE RIGHT CHOICE* (Grades 3-6)

What do animals need to be happy and healthy? Which animals make good pets? Students will gain a deeper understanding of natural behaviours of animals kept as pets and reflect on whether we can provide an engaging environment.

INCLUDING ANIMALS IN SOCIAL JUSTICE* (Grades 6-12)

How do we perceive animals in our society? Students will investigate beliefs and stereotypes, question socially accepted practices, and analyze animal welfare issues in our world today.

WILDLIFE WONDERS (NEW!) (Grades 3-7)

What happens when wildlife and humans share the same space? In this presentation, students will learn about real wildlife cases and the work of the BC SPCA to identify ways they can help ensure wildlife lead happy and healthy lives, with minimal human interactions.

CAT TALES*(Grades 3-6)

What is life really like for an outdoor cat? And what effect do outdoor cats have on the ecosystem? Through stories, students will connect to real-life issues facing our feline friends. Students will be challenged to use their critical thinking skills to question socially acceptable norms and find creative solutions to issues.
