Answer Key and Eplanations of Hazard:

Car – Pets can be run over or hurt if left in a hot car

Antifreeze - Ethylene glycol antifreeze is toxic to pets, even in small quantities

Fire – Open flames can burn curious pets

Recliner – Small dogs or tails can get caught up in the gears of reclining chairs

Candle – Open flames can burn curious pets

Holiday ornaments – Sharp pieces of ornaments can be swallowed by pets

Toilets - Toilet cleaners may be dangerous to animals that drink from toilets

Rocking Horse - Unlucky paws can become caught under rocking horses or chairs

Toddler – Small children do not know how to safely handle pets and should be supervised

Medicine – Pets can be poisoned by ingesting medicines meant for humans

Outdoor Cats – If your dog has a prey drive it could see an outdoor cat and give chase

Open Door – Inside pets can escape through open doors

Cleaners – Many household cleaners are toxic if ingested by pets

Laundry detergent – Laundry detergent can be toxic to pets

Birthday cake - Chocolate is toxic for dogs

Chicken Bones – Cooked chicken bones may splinter into sharp pieces if chewed by pets

Bats – If your pet is bitten by a bat or other wild animal, it could contract diseases

Mousetrap – Mousetraps can snap shut on unsuspecting pets

Rat Poison – Pets can accidentally ingest rat poison

House Plants - Many common household plants can be poisonous to pets
