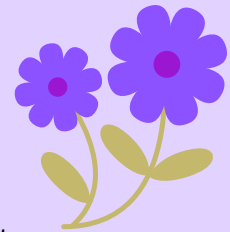
Lego's Story

Adoption Profile:

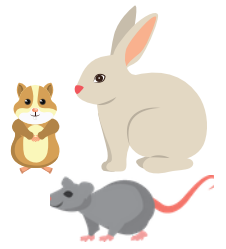
- 1 month old black and white mouse
