# **Fred and George's Story**

Unfortunately, Fred and George did not get along with Percy and their new guardians did not have the space to keep them in their own cage, so they were returned to the BC SPCA.

Fred and George are a playful, bonded pair that must go to a home together without other rats. They enjoy spending time outside of their cage with people and learning new tricks!

- Are fine with other calm animals in the house, but shouldn't be kept with other rats

### **Bonded Buddies...**

Rats are highly social creatures and should not be kept alone! Two or more rats can happily live together provided they have a large enough habitat and they are the same sex (unless they are spayed or neutered). They'll eat together, groom each other, play and sleep together. Sometimes these rats will develop such close relationships they become "bonded', and shelters will make sure these best friends are adopted together!

# **Applicant 1: Yvonne Starling**


